Visioning Committee and Property Committee

The Visioning Committee and Property Committee have been working collaboratively in completing our stair replacement project. A lot of planning and work has gone into the stairs thus far; establishing the footings, laying up the walls, forming for the concrete, rebar reinforcement and light fixture rough-ins. Thank you to everyone who has volunteered their personal time to help with this exciting project. We are pleased to announce that the stairs are currently under budget however we admit that we are currently behind schedule. We are waiting on our concrete subcontractor to complete the first of two concrete pours. The remaining work is dependent on the concrete work being completed. Unfortunately contractors in this field are behind schedule due to the amount of rain we received this summer. It is expected that both concrete pours will be completed the week of October 3rd. After that, the bulk of the work will have been completed and then all that will remain will be the stone facing, new handrails and ground restoration for this year.

The Visioning Committee is currently planning for the reinstatement of the bell that was removed in order to permit construction of the stairwell. Plans have not yet been finalized however we have discussed that the bell will be relocated to the south side of the church under the large stained glass window and surrounded by a seating area and gardens. With the bell being located on the south side of the church, it will become a desired focal point of its own and be visible to those that visit our downtown core and the Farmers Market.

Please remain confident that this project will be completed successfully.

Come on out for some foot stomping, good old fashioned fun. Gary will make us laugh, Kristin will make us cry, and Bruce will keep the whole train moving.



We have renewed the rental agreement with the Seventh Day Adventists for another three years. Our first year has gone well, and we look forward to sharing our space with them on Saturdays and Tuesday evenings for another three years!

Partnering for Mission

Trinity and Primrose joint council has recently signed two partnership agreements that will contribute significantly to our ability to respond to God's call given to us in Micah 8:6.

Through our partnership with *First Line for Syria*, the Pastoral Charge will continue refugee support. Although the work is mainly carried out through those connected to the First Line for Syria group, all of us will have an opportunity to hear more about their work and to support it as we feel called, either with financial support or through offering our gifts of time and talent.



Partera Peacebuilders International provides us with the opportunity to help in building peace locally and globally, through the work of LeeAnn McKenna and her organization. Imagine being able to assist in hosting educational events on anti-racism, inclusivity and anti-bullying. This is only some of the work that LeeAnn does, that we will have opportunities to learn more about, and again to support through our offerings of time, talent and resources.

Pastoral Charge Mission & Outreach Committee: Both of these partnerships are only the beginning. The plan is to bring their work, along with other work we are doing or have done through Kairos, Truth & Reconciliation, Mission and Service, the Farmer's Market, The Quiet Garden Movement (Primrose) and more, under the umbrella of a brand new Pastoral Charge Mission & Outreach Committee. If any of this work interests you, then watch for opportunities to serve in these areas.
