WOW Region Report Fall - November 12-13, 2021



Our fall regional meeting, via zoom, opened with welcome and President Mark Laird's message based on the theme "Resurrection not Resuscitation". Following the land acknowledgement we had a worship time. An attempt at community building did not work as technology gremlins were at work! Following opening and procedural motions we honoured the retirees for our region and recognized those who had passed away since June.

Licensed Lay Worship Leaders are those who have expressed an interest in leading worship for the United Church. There is a list available from Diane Blanchard and we are fortunate to have one member in our local community.

Stewardship chair Dave Jagger gave an outline of what resources are available from the United Church. We were reminded to do our homework and be prepared to discuss the land acknowledgement and the treaties that were involved in settling our areas. Friday evening's meeting closed with prayer.

WOW Region Report Fall - November 12-13, 2021 Continued

Saturday morning, we reconvened at 9:30 with a welcome, the territorial acknowledgements and worship. For community building our group of five discussed how our churches do the territorial acknowledgements. Because Dufferin County has a number of rivers rising, the area was very important to the Indian tribes. Dufferin is the traditional territory of the Petun, the Neutral, the Six Nations and the Anishinaabe peoples. The treaty lands were named in the Haldimand Deed of 1784 and the two Williams Treaties of 1818.

A proposal to go to General Council (highest court in the United Church) regarding the inclusion of rest and renewal for General Council and regional staff during sabbatical was discussed and forwarded to the General Council.

The Mission and Discipleship Commission liaisons with grant recipients so their celebrations and their struggles are known. M & D Commission helps with communication and amplification of programs, events and initiatives - getting the word out. Money used by this commission comes from our mission and service dollars that we give to our churches. Grants, totalling \$126,600.00, given in the fall of 21 for the fiscal year 2022 were to chaplaincies, camps, resource centres and faith development for youth and young adults. It has been a challenging year for many of the communities of faith and the commission aims to share stories and to work with the needs of the area.

Our next presentation was by United Property Resource Corporation which has been created by the United Church to bring professional real estate expertise to communities of faith providing them with the information needed to make good decisions about their real estate. Churches can access the services of UPRC in their property deliberations helping make the best use of their real estate assets to renew their mission and sustain a long-lasting legacy in their neighbourhood.

It is important to keep our profile updated yearly on church hub. After lunch the Human Resources Commission which serves as liaisons to congregations in search and selection processes and congregational meetings gave a presentation. Facilitating the United Fresh Start program, they also help with getting an intern ministry organized and act as a resource for the community of faith ending a pastoral relationship.

Gavin Williams and Young Seo were introduced and each gave a short address to the court. Their service of admittance was held in Fergus United Church on Sunday evening, November 14, 2021.

Brent Caslick presented financials for the 2021 year to date and the 2022 budget. It was agreed that PWC would continue to perform the audit for 2021. The operating budget for 2022 was discussed and carried. Courtesies were given by Mark Laird thanking all who had a part to play in the meeting. Closing worship included a humourous skit.

During our breakout sessions for community building, I renewed acquaintances with two ladies that I had served with in Northern Waters Presbytery and met a granddaughter of Harold and Gladys McGhee, former members of Trinity United Church, Shelburne. With an average of 135 attending each session breakout rooms are a great way to meet people from around the regions and find out about their churches and how they are serving their communities. Hopefully our next gathering in the spring of 2022 can be a face-to-face event.

Thankfully, the gentleman involved in the crash is fine!




Care Group News

First Line for Syria Report

First Line for Syria wishes to share the wonderful news that our sponsored refugee family has now finally made it here. After an extremely long, (and very stressful), day of travelling, they arrived safely in Canada on October 21. The feeling of relief to have them finally "home" cannot be overstated. Let's just say many tears were shed that day!

The family has completed their mandatory two-week quarantine period and First Line for Syria and local relatives have been very busy making arrangements to ensure that the transition to Canadian society goes as smoothly as possible.

Educational assessments were arranged for the first day the children were out of quarantine. We're happy to report that all the children have now started school in Alliston and are adjusting very well! These children have not had any form of schooling for the past eight years, but they are all eager to learn. Thankfully they also have seven cousins in Alliston, who are eager to help them learn English! We're so proud of them and are looking forward to supporting them on this journey.

The family have already hosted a gathering of gratitude at their new home to celebrate their arrival. First Line for Syria members spent the day enjoying the company of our new friends and eating delicious Syrian food.

We also learned more about their lives in the refugee camp, which can best be described as a prison. The more we learn about their experiences to date, the more we are horrified, and the more we are impressed by our family's resilience. There is no doubt that this is a family with immense personal strength.

When asked how they are adjusting to their new lives in Canada, the father responded, "If the refugee camp is the ground, then Canada is the moon."

We are extremely grateful that we have finally managed to get this family out of these horrendous living conditions in the refugee camp. Our hope is to eventually also be able to bring out the remaining family members, as 2 brothers/sisters-in-law and their children are still stuck there. The videos of our family saying goodbye to these close relatives (who our family had shared intimate lives within the past 8 years) were just beyond heartbreaking.

First Line for Syria wishes to thank Shelburne Primrose Pastoral Charge for all their support over these past 4 years. Our prayer is that it will not take as long to get the next batch of family members here. Stay tuned for more announcements in this regard!


