God of the rainbow God of the cross God of the empty grave How does the creature say Grace How does the creature say Thanks





First Line for Syria Update

Summer is over. First Line for Syria has been spending lots of time with our new family, doing various activities, while hoping for more news about our next two families' arrivals. These two families are still languishing - for over 9 years- in terrible conditions in the Azraq Refugee camp, in cramped quarters in the desert Jordan. Once we know these families' arrival dates, we will ramp up our fund-raising drive again. We hope for some news in this regard soon!

This summer we arranged for 4 of the Al Diri children to receive private swimming lessons and they all mastered the art of swimming quickly! Some of the kids also were signed up for soccer and did marvelously well. Otherwise, we enjoyed the festivities of Canada day together and we also had a marvelous outing to Canada's Wonderland! Through the summer months, Ruwaida and some of her children, also took part in the "trust yourself to garden" program at "Am Braigh" farm in Mono. This opportunity was offered by Jamie Richards, and it brought together many of the recent newcomers to our area. They each got their own garden plot, where they grew a variety of vegetables. The season was finished off with a celebratory international meal.

In August, Karin and Wally, on behalf of FLFS, hosted a large gathering for our local community, some members of our congregations, and many newcomers. We had lots of fun, plus ate marvelous food from the many corners of the world for our potluck meal. We played soccer and had a variety of other games. The children also flew kites, cuddled with puppies, and enjoyed the trampoline. Well over 75 people showed up for this day of fun and getting to know one another. We had newcomers from the Middle East, from Asia and Africa joyfully taking part in this multicultural gathering. Our first sponsored family: Khaleel, Sabah and Helin, also came for a four day visit from London (Ontario) and stayed with Karin and Wally. It was so wonderful to reconnect! Helin is now in her 3rd year of university, and she is doing very well.


After 8 years of zero dental care while in a squalid refugee camp our Al Diri family has needed many visits to a local dentist. Some of these costs, for the younger children, have been covered by the Healthy Smiles program, while FLFS have covered all the dental costs for the adults. This is one of the things we had budgeted for and it was indeed much needed!

Through the summer we have continued making sure our Al Diri family has had private ESL lessonsand their English is now coming along nicely. They have now finally been enrolled in official community-run ESL lessons, which are held daily at the Focus Learning Center in Alliston. Four members of the Al Diri family also now have their G1 license, and they have been taking drivinglessons, given by Karin, and all are making good strides! The two adults are now also signed up for official lessons in Barrie, starting mid-October. We are certain they will get their driving licenses as soon as this course is finished.

As always, we thank the Shelburne Primrose Pastoral Charge for supporting our refugee work. Please know that, with your help, we are making a real difference in the lives of some wonderful people who already are valued members of our Canadian multicultural mosaic.

News from the FoodbanK:

As our town continues to experience growth, so does the foodbanK. Numbers of families counting on the foodbanK have continued to rise and there is rarely a shift that we are not welcoming several new faces to our services. The rise in numbers has had us meeting with town council to discuss the need for increased space and support and this will be an ongoing theme in the next months.

We continue to rely on the generosity of our community, where neighbours help neighbours, and this summer MANY supported the foodbanK with fresh produce from their gardens which each week, clients could freely take.

We continue to host our seniors' market monthly, taking fresh produce and essentials to the seniors' homes in town.

With Rotary support, over 120 backpacks with lunch boxes and water bottles were given out.

However, in order to be able to continue to give out the food hampers, we have used a lot of our monetary reserves, constantly buying stock in greater numbers. Now we are approaching the time where we need to replenish both stock and accounts and we hope this Thanksgiving you will prayerfully consider how you can help your neighbour.

There are some Thanksgiving Food drives coming up and we are in great need of cooking oil, peanut butter, canned fruit, breakfast cereal, and kids' snacks. Or please consider adding a donation to your offering cheque where it can be included in your yearly tax receipt and will be put in the foodbanK account. 100% of donations go directly to serving our clients.

Many thanks for the ongoing support that our partnership with Trinity United has given us!! May it be a Happy Thanksgiving for all the residents in Shelburne!
