First Line For Syria - Summer 2022 report to Shelburne Primrose Pastoral Charge

First Line For Syria has been busy helping our family as they adjust to life in Canada. Some of us are tutoring ESL, at least twice weekly, and we can report that the adults are making amazing progress! We drive them to dentists, to eye doctors and offer assistance with medical appointments, and we help with driving lessons. Most of all, we enjoy having social times together; going for hikes, visiting each other's homes, having meals together, plus letting the children interact with our dogs, pups, and our farm animals. We have sewing sessions and have done some gardening. Many of the children wanted to be signed up for soccer this summer too.

We also support the children in their school-environment, as needed. The young children in primary grades feel welcome in Alliston and have had a seamless transition to their schools. They are becoming proficient in English, plus they are making friends. However, the high school students have been exposed to some bullying, rooted in racism. Dealing with this has been a stressful time for the teenagers, and for their parents. We have been trying to advocate on their behalf and to work constructively with the school administration, to find a solution to this.

The mother in our family has signed up with the organization "Trust Yourself to Garden" which is held at AmBraigh Farm. The farmer, Jamie Richards, has gathered 5 volunteers for a pilot project, where the participants will attend the farm once a week until mid-August. Ruwaida has planted seeds and seedlings in her own plot, these were provided for free from the farm. Everything the participants grow there belong to them. They even have a translator on hand. Ruwaida enjoys gardening and this project has connected her with other newcomers and likeminded locals. It is an obvious pleasure for Ruwaida to be growing vegetables for her family!

We received unexpected news in May that one of the families we were on the "approved UCC list" for upcoming sponsorship, (close relatives of the family we have recently brought over), had suddenly been granted entry into the United States. Their previous application to the US was rejected when President Trump took office but has now been approved after all. They arrived within days of their approval going through, and are now settling in Cincinnati, Ohio!

This mean that instead of bringing in two more brothers and their families this year, we will be only bringing in one. We are, however, moving forward in sponsoring Ruwaida's brother and his family, since they are also sitting in the very same refugee camp in squalid conditions. We are submitting this new application to the United Church of Canada shortly and hopefully this will also be approved soon. One of the children is suffering from Leukemia and we are hoping that since this is a matter of life and death, for a young child, that they will speed up the process.

Our fundraising process is therefore ongoing! During the Blues and Jazz fest in Orangeville FLFS was the main local charity featured and we had a busy booth there. Our next fundraiser will be a samosa sale. Please see the attached flyer for details. Deadline for ordering is June 20^{th!}

WOW Meeting, Spring 2022

Our WOW regional meeting was held May 6-7, 2022, via zoom with at least 125 in attendance at each session.

Our president elect, Mark Laird, opened the meeting leading to worship centred on the word "Mission". This word has many meanings and to the indigenous people the negative connotations are significant. What word would you use to replace 'mission'? Did you know that the word "mission" does not appear in the Bible? Words do matter. We must learn to use them wisely.

Anti-bullying was addressed on Saturday morning. Based on the story of David in the books of Samuel the skits presented bullying in biblical and present times. Resources are available if anyone feels there is bullying in the church, Contact the region office for more information.

Next topic, presented by King Jules, dealt with personal pronouns. What are your pronouns? Mine are she/her. Did you know you are "cisgender" if you identify yourself with the gender that corresponds to your birth sex?

Using the story of Jacob and Esau, the division of Korea for the last 70 years was presented. The United Church is seeking 10,000 signatures on a petition to end this injustice.

Since it is the 60th anniversary of UCW this year the UCW leaders did the worship after lunch. "Women for change in Zambia" provides educational opportunities for women there and so far over \$81.000.00 has been raised. Sydney, Nova Scotia will be the host for the anniversary celebrations.

All the staff were commended for their service through the past year. In Memoriam time was held as well as recognition of multiple years of service.

There will be a new edition of the hymns coming soon.

Closing motions and courtesies followed the covenanting of the new commissioners, new executive, and present commission members.

Our next meeting will be held November 18th & 19th, 2022. May 26 & 27, 2023 will be the next spring meeting.

Shepherd's Cupboard Foodbank

The Foodbank continues to be a busy place. Numbers continue to rise with new clients arriving each week. High housing/rental costs, rising costs of food and a myriad of other issues all impact the financial ability of individuals and families to get enough to eat. We continue to serve every week everyone who arrives, but with ongoing issues of supply. The summer is what we call our 'lean' times - donations both financial and food, seem to dwindle and we struggle to pay for and stock the increasing demands each month.

With county services re-opening, we've had to move from the space available we had during COVID times. That, coupled with increased client numbers, has forced us to continue using the model of serving clients outside the building and has us now contemplating whether we need to consider a bigger space/building as we move forward. The rise in the cost of food is quickly causing a dent in our financial reserves and we are anxious about what the future holds.

We greatly appreciate the interest and the prayerful support of this congregation. We are very happy to have had Rev. Valerie step into the role of chair of the Food Bank Board as we enter the summer.

We are currently posting on our Facebook page each month our greatest needs for the month ahead and you can follow us at The Shepherd's Cupboard Foodbank.

At this time, we are looking for donations of diapers - size 4,5,6, canned fruit, and cooking oil. Donations can be left at the church or in the front containers at either grocery store. Financial donations can be made through the church or by e-transfer and tax receipts provided as requested.
